"Unclaimed Child Support Checks" The Honorable Dorothy Brown, Clerk of the Circuit Court of Cook County, has instituted public access to an on-line search for unclaimed child support checks. Cook County citizens who believe they may not have received all child support checks, can log-on to the Clerk's Office website at <http://www.cookcountyclerkofcourt.org> and link to "Unclaimed Child Support Check Search" to enter their criteria, such as case numbers or recipient names. If the recipient's name is found in the search of unclaimed child support checks, he or she will be directed to contact the Clerk's Office. Once the recipient updates his or her information, the Clerk's Office will re-issue and mail the check to the correct location.
