**Clerk Brown to Host 200 High School Girls For  
“Women Everywhere: Partners in Service Project”**

**What:** The Honorable Dorothy Brown, Clerk of the Circuit Court of Cook County, has invited 200 high school girls to her office in the Daley Center as part of the “Women Everywhere: Partners in Service Project.” Clerk Brown, the first African American elected to her position, will speak to the young women about what they are capable of accomplishing, and introduce them to the women attorneys and other successful women on the Clerk’s Office staff.

In addition, Clerk Brown will present an overview of the Clerk’s Office, specifically focusing on areas that involve youth issues, and participate in a question and answer session with the girls.

“I am always honored to show young people the career opportunities available through the Clerk’s Office and speak to them about their goals in life,” said Clerk Brown. “‘Women Everywhere’ is such a worthy project, capable of positively influencing and encouraging young women throughout the state.”

**Details:** The girls that will visit the Clerk’s Office are from the following schools: Calumet Career Prep Academy, Curie Metro High School, Evanston High School, Juarez High School, Morton West High School, Rolling Meadows High School, Wells High School, Whitney Young Magnet High School and William Jones College Prep.

Through “Women Everywhere,” an estimated 400 Illinois attorneys volunteer their time on an annual service day to community agencies serving women and their children in need or to education projects benefiting young women and girls.
